

EUROPEAN MASTER IN PROJECT MANAGEMENT – EUROMPM – IT CONTENT AND STRUCTURE

Degree Program Profile

The degree program is a consecutive application-oriented degree program. Accordingly, admission requires a first graduate degree imparting professional skills (bachelor's degree or (German) Diplom). The criteria for an application-oriented degree program are met both with regard to content and by the lecturers' quality as these have experience in the job-specific application of academic findings in addition to their academic qualification.

The relevant profile elements are:

- focus on the application area project management
- investigation and development of project management as an academic field
- communication of the interdisciplinary and cross-domain character of project management through the selection of modules and specialisations and by integrating several disciplines in Dortmund and at partner institutions.
- the international focus with the integration in a network of renowned European universities
- the high share of practical and project-related work in the curriculum, both by the elements of the course modules throughout the semester and by the independent work dominating the third and fourth semesters; this profile element is reinforced by the cooperation of lecturers from the industry with long-term associations with the University of Applied Sciences and Arts
- consolidation of the academic element by integration in F&E activities of the universities via the project thesis and the specialization
- the 4-semester master's program EuroMPM-IT-4semesters also offered by the University of Applied Sciences and Arts is complemented by the IT and technology oriented profile element

The program qualifies for being a leading expert in business administration projects The study course *European Master in Project Management – EuroMPM –* will lead to a university degree which is highly qualified academically and professionally. It prepares for projects in higher management in industry, organizations and public administrations. The students will learn skills and methods to achieve these objectives. The modules will be taught and applied on the basis of scientific development in order to enable the students to adjust to the requirements and changes of business life. The students will thus be able to analyze proce-





dures and problems in application, to work on professional solutions and to observe non-professional requirements. It is our aim to teach students to gain professional and methodical knowledge as well as personal and social competence. Students will be enabled to act with responsibility and reliability. The international dimension will be promoted by an optional semester or a short-term stays for block weeks abroad at one of the international partner universities.

Study contents consider the specifications of the *International Associations for Project Management* (PMI®, IPMA®, GPM).

The language of instruction is English.

The minimum period of study is four semesters, which includes all assessment tests and examinations. The study course was developed by representatives of several European universities and is being offered simultaneously at the following universities:

- Norwegian University of Science and Technology NTNU in Trondheim,
 Norway
- University of the Basque Country in Bilbao, Spain
- University of Applied Sciences and Arts in Dortmund, Germany
- National University of Construction and Architecture in Kiev, Ukraine
- Ternopil National Economic University in Ternopil, Ukraine
- Kaunas Technological University in Kaunas, Lithuania

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Required degree

Diplom or bachelor degree

A Bachelor or "Diplom" degree or an equivalent (the degree must be accredited) from a university of applied sciences (Fachhochschule) or a university, or the completion of a corresponding accredited bachelor qualification program at a university of cooperative education (Berufsakademie) with an overall grade of at least "good" (2.3). It must have included for the European Master in Project Management – IT Project Management (EuroMPM-IT) relevant competences in the areas of Computer Science, Business Science and/or Project Management (cf. Study and examination regulation on www.fh-dortmund.de/pruefungsordnung).

"Diplom" or bachelor courses in business information systems meet these requirements. In addition, the course of study must amount to a minimum of **180** credit points of the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS). Course programs completed at foreign universities must also include a final thesis comparable to the course programs at German universities with regard to the minimum quality requirements. The Expert Committee decides whether equivalence is demonstrated.

Proof of English language skills

Evidence of sufficient English skills provided by a TOEFL-ITP test with at least 550 points or a TOEFL-iBT test amounting to a minimum of 90 points passed within the two years before the application was submitted. The evidence may also be provided by other test methods equivalent to the TOEFL test (e.g. IELTS with at

least 6.5 points) or by equivalent credit points and examination results. In exceptional cases the evidence can be submitted by means of an equivalent certificate or test results demonstrating the relevant minimum requirements (equivalent to C1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR)). The Expert Committee decides whether equivalence is demonstrated.

Pre-Check Form

In order to be able to verify before the application whether you meet the requirements for admission to the program all applicants (EU, German, non-EU) are highly recommended to send us their documents for a pre-check to eurompm@fh-dortmund.de.

Therefore, please send one PDF containing your bachelor's certificate and transcripts, your CV, your language certificates and the filled-out form sheet. After the pre-check you will be provided with instructions and a link to the online portal.

APPLICATION AND ADMISSION

The courses of the EuroMPM start in the winter semester only and are usually offered in an annual frequency. Allocation of study places will be made by the Fachhochschule. Although there is no admission restriction for the European Master in Project Management, the above specified requirements are valid.

EU-nationals and with EU-nationals equated

EU-nationals and with EU-nationals equated, meaning:

- EU-nationals.
- Non-EU nationals who have obtained their university entrance qualification within the EU or Liechtenstein, Norway or Iceland,
- Members of the European Economic Area (EEA): Norway, Liechtenstein and Iceland.
- Non-EU nationals who live in Germany and married to an EU- or EEA-national who are working in Germany, or
- Non-EU nationals who live in Germany and have a parent who is EU- or EEAnational and has worked or work in Germany,
