

Covering of costs for editorial support

Fachhochschule Dortmund is upon to support doctoral students who draft their doctoral thesis or further disciplinary publications in another language than their native language. The costs that arise for receiving editorial support will be covered up to an amount of 500 euros by a funding of the Graduate Center.

The funding can be claimed once or repeatedly during the time of the doctoral studies until the funding amount of 500 euros per doctoral student is reached.

Which types of proofreading are financially supported?

The Graduate Center supports proofreading before submission or publication of the doctoral thesis as well as papers and scientific lectures for which a proof for the acceptance of a conference or a publication is required.

It is only applicable for texts that are not being written in the doctoral students' native language. International doctoral students can also apply for a grant for the proofreading of texts written in German.

Who is eligible to apply?

Every doctoral student enrolled at Fachhochschule Dortmund and registered at the Graduate Center is eligible for editorial support.

How to apply for the proofreading grant?

Doctoral students can, at any times, apply for an editorial support through informal application, which should contain following information and is addressed to the Graduate Center:

- Type of the text being proofread including number of characters
- Current state of the doctoral thesis or proof for the acceptance of a conference or publication
- Name of the proofreading provider (if applicable link to their website),
 explanation of the specialist qualification
- Expected total costs, respectively costs per standard page (30 lines á 60 characters)

Further procedure regarding the contract and invoice will be arranged individually.
