The doctoral candidate must publish at least \_\_\_\_\_\_ (peer-reviewed) papers on their doctoral topic as part of their doctoral project. The supervisors will provide subject-specific and organizational support.

The doctoral candidate has been informed about the Guidelines for Safeguarding Good Research Practice. Both supervisors will provide in-depth knowledge of the respective codes of good research practice in force at both institutions involved and observe their compliance. The doctoral candidate agrees to observe and act in accordance with the rules of both regulations as well as with the Code for Safeguarding Good Research Practice issued by the DFG.<sup>1</sup>

#### 3. Supervision regulations

The doctoral candidate is obliged to report regularly to their supervisors about the research findings. Every \_\_\_\_\_\_ weeks/months, they will present the partial content results, document the further procedure, and discuss it with the supervisors.

The supervisors will regularly offer subject and content-related advice to the doctoral candidate. The professional advice and support aim to promote the early independent research of the doctoral student. In addition, the doctoral candidate will be introduced into the scientific community and encouraged to publish and present their findings. Additionally, the supervisors will also support the doctoral student in starting their further career.<sup>2</sup>

All parties involved will seek to address and amicably resolve any conflicts that may arise during the duration of the doctoral studies. Should this not be successful, an unbiased third person will be asked to mediate between the persons involved.

#### 4. Scientific, extra-disciplinary and professional further qualification

The doctoral student can participate in the further qualification program of the Graduate Center at Fachhochschule Dortmund. If the requirements are met, the doctoral candidate will obtain a certificate of completion. The candidate can also participate in further qualification offers of the cooperating university. In cases of equivalence, a mutual recognition of academic achievements will be encouraged.
